Effective Enforcement of Restraining & Protection Orders

The looming statistics of domestic violence implications to the individuals involved and societies around them appear to be similar globally. Restraining and protection orders are the most customary penal measures, yet 30%-60%* are commonly breached and their enforcement is proving a challenging mission.

Multiple Security Layers

A proven technology tool is harnessed to build up the sense of security of victims, while providing better supervision of aggressors' compliance with court orders. This is achieved through the creation of security layers around the victim and parallel notification layers around the aggressor. Enforcement agencies are provided early alerts to potentially violent encounters between the victim and the aggressor.

Early Alerts & Improved Enforcement

Elmo-Tech's technology is provided to enforcement and welfare agencies and monitoring centre operators:

Early alerts to aggressors' actions:

- Real time tracking of aggressor's whereabouts
- Prompt alerts to the aggressor's approach to the security perimeters around the victim, delivered simultaneously to both the victim and designated enforcement agencies
- Warnings to aggressors as they enters an off limits zone

Victim's security means:

- Multiple security perimeters for the victim at fixed locations
- Optional tracking of victims' whereabouts:
 - › To secure them on the move
 - › For warning purposes
- Victim tracking unit doubles as an emergency phone to enforcement agencies

Successful 5 Year Project in Europe

A fruitful cooperation with several enforcement agencies and other stakeholders in Spain, have led to the development of such a tracking program by the Community of Madrid in 2005. A similar program was later introduced in the Balearic Islands and these are nowadays joined by a national level program launched by the Spanish Ministry of Equality.
